- 3. Open the Web map.

 - An applicable title,
 - Unique and appropriate symbology,
 - Pictures (that you have found online) related to the location,
 - And a description (at least 1-2 sentences).
- 7. Once you have created all the Map Notes, zoom into each of the cities and explore the surroundings.
- Q Based on the location of each of the cities, what similarities do you notice between all three of them?
- 8. Search for the "Earth at Night" layer and add it to your map.
- 9. Explore the map and compare Africa to other continents.
- Q To what extent is the light at night connected to the development of a country or continent?
