


RECYCLED ORNAMENTS




RECYCLED NOTEBOOK

DIY Gifts

Here are some handmade gift ideas that are super easy to make!

PEPPERMINT BATH SALT

- 1.5 cups epsom salt
- 0.5 cup coarse sea salt
- 10 drops Peppermint essential oil
- 1 tsp pomegranate juice (optional)
- Jars to put the bath salt in Makes approx. 2 cups Note: Store in fridge and use within 3. Fill jars with the bath salt. If using 1 week if using pomegranate juice.
- 1. Mix all ingredients except the pomegranate juice in a large bowl. Split the mixture into two bowls if using pomegranate juice.
 - 2.(Optional) Add the pomegranate juice to one bowl and mix.
 - pomegranate juice, layer jars alternating with the white and pink salts until full.

BEESWAX WRAP

- Beeswax (beads or grated)
- Cotton fabric
- Parchment paper
- Brush (optional)

- 1. Preheat oven to 200F
- 2. Cut fabric to desired size.
- 3. Lay parchment paper on baking sheet. Place fabric on the paper and sprinkle the beeswax.
- 4. Place baking sheet in oven for 5-10 minutes, or until the beeswax is melted.
- 5. Spread melted wax with the brush and let cool.

GINGERBREAD BODY SCRUB

- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup coconut oil
- 1 Tbsp molasses
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp ground ginger
- 1/3 tsp ground cloves
- Jars

- 1. Mix all dry ingredients in a bowl.
- 2. Add wet ingredients and mix until fully combined.
- 3. Fill jars with the body scrub. Store at room temperature.

How to use: Place body scrub on wet skin and exfoliate using hands. Wash off with water.





Green Holiday Tips

Some tips to stay eco-friendly this holiday season!

GIFT WRAPPING

- Fabric (e.g. scarves, tea towels)
- Reusable Bags
- Paper boxes
- Glitter-free wrapping paper
- Containers (e.g. tins, jars)
- Use pressed flowers, leaves, and twine for decoration
- Reuse items such as bows and gift bags



HANDMADE GIFTS

Handmade items make great gifts, and are usually eco-friendly. Use your skills and talents to create anything from a knitted scarf, a song you wrote (and a performance!), baked goods (Yum!), or a booklet of funny drawings.

CHRISTMAS TREE

Real or artificial? Real Christmas trees are better for the environment than most people think. Christmas trees are grown on farms, and farmers usually plant a new tree every time one is cut down. Real trees are recyclable and compostable, and they smell amazing! Although artificial trees are reusable, they become plastic waste at the end of their lifetime and they are difficult to recycle. If your family already owns an artificial tree, then reuse it for as many years as possible, but if not, a real tree is the way to go. Potted trees are a great option because they last for years, and produce no plastic waste. You can also rent potted Christmas trees from *Evergrow Christmas Trees*, if you don't want to keep a tree year-round.
